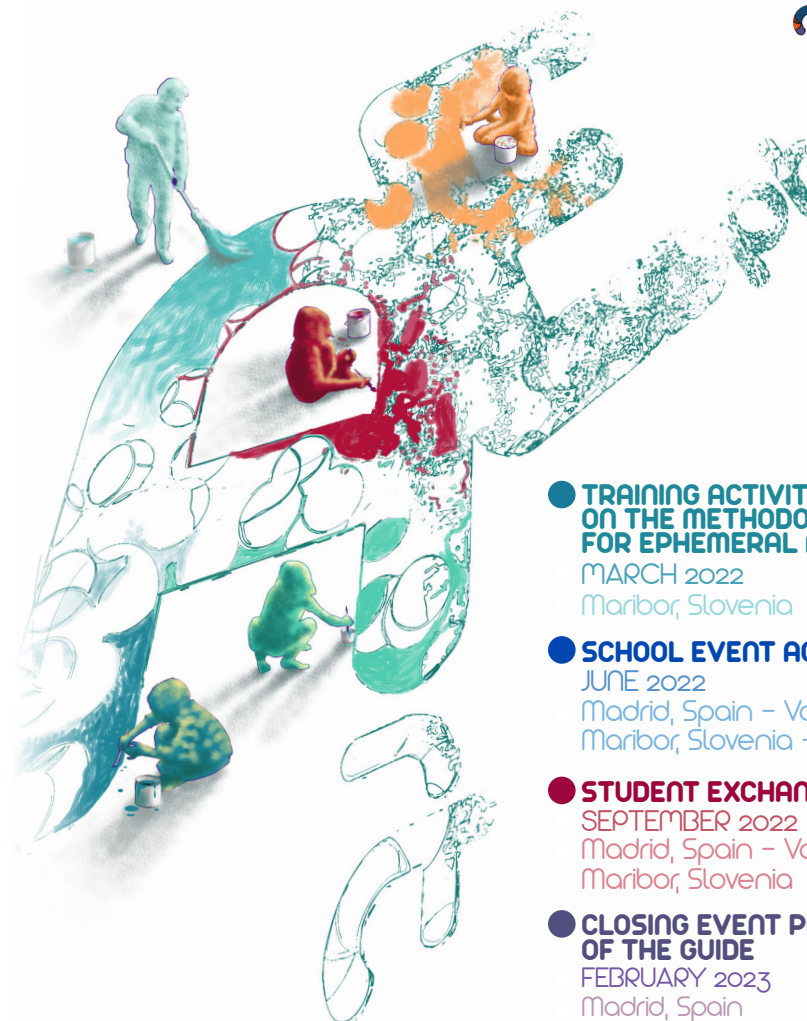
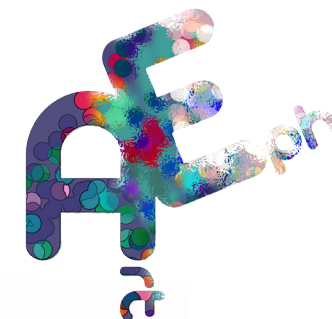

## SUMMARY OF THE PROJECT

### ARTEPHEMERAL IN SCHOOL

EDUCATION is a two-year strategic association project jointly implemented in four partnering countries – Turkey, Slovenia, Spain, and Italy, with the main goal of shaping educational techniques through Ephemeral Art, in order to ensure the development of key competencies of future generations, which will improve their possibilities of job employment.

Our project will go in line with the EU Programme "Creative Europe", which promotes the cultural and creative sectors to ensure the continued development of society and insists on the necessity of acquiring essential skills that can enable each individual to reach a full personal, social and professional development.



## Activities

### Training Activity for Teachers on the Methodological Guide for Ephemeral Art Teaching.

March 2022 Maribor, Slovenia.

The participants will be teachers, who will be trained in design software and 3D modeling as well as other technological tools in order to facilitate the teaching and development of projects with students. The artistic component will be conceived as a tool to improve the key skills of students. At the end of the training, the teachers will have to develop a project which involves ephemeral art, that will be put into practice in their educational centers in order to test the methodological approach that they assimilated and to transmit their new knowledge to the students.



### School Event Activity

June 2022 Madrid, Spain;  
Vasto – Italy; Maribor – Slovenia;

A school event in each country will take place. All art projects created by the students will be shown through exhibition, with the participation of their families, public authorities and teachers. An expert committee will evaluate and judge the artworks and will choose the winning team, who will be offered a special award. The winning group will have the opportunity to participate in the Student Exchange Mobility.

### GUIDE FOR EPHEMERAL ART TEACHING IN SCHOOL

This guide will include information on the best practices developed by professionals and organizations on how to use Ephemeral Art as an open and free socio-educational tool that can be applied to different subjects at school and/or as part of the Visual and Plastic Arts curriculum. It will contain theoretical material on activities promoting the inclusion of students, especially those with fewer opportunities within the school environment through informal and non-formal learning (including digital work and the use of new technologies) with a cultural and creative component to help the students to acquire key skills and competences. In addition, the guide will incorporate the projects developed by the students, dedicating a special space to the winners.
